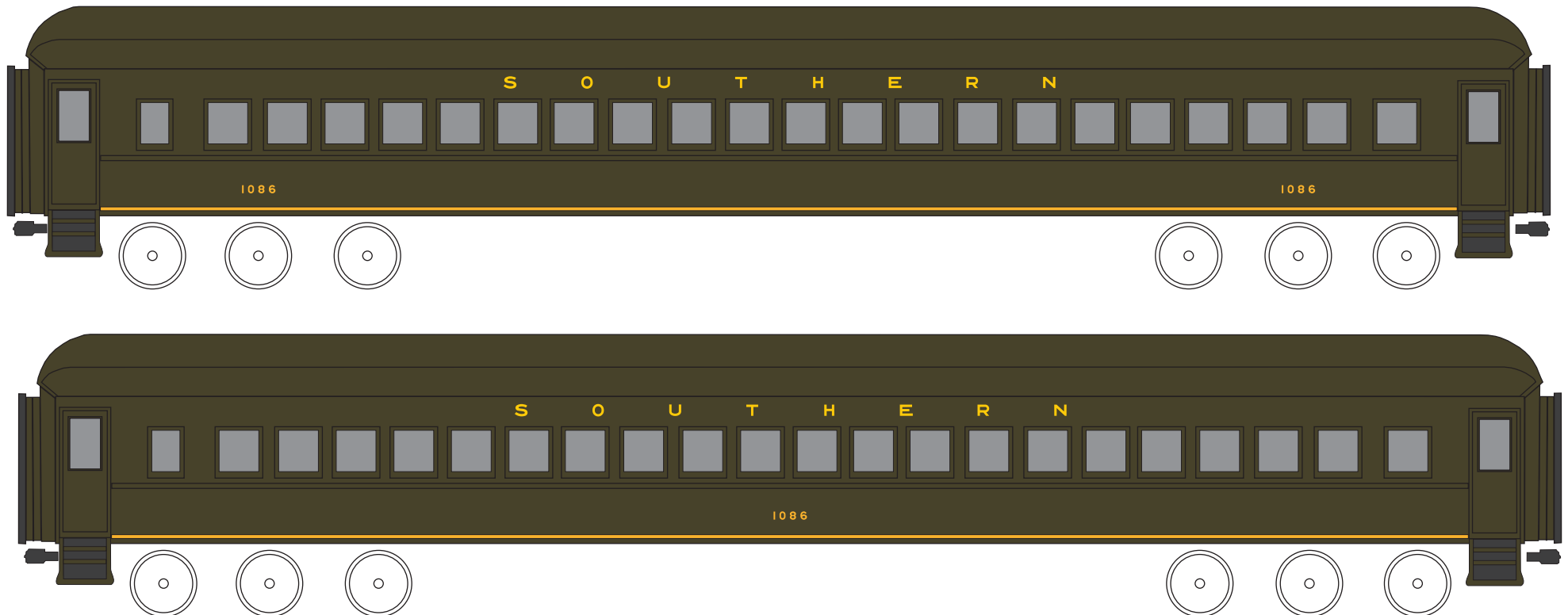

Southern Railway Single Window coaches were painted standard Pullman Green. In the 1940s, SR began repainting the lettering using the block style lettering adopted for the streamline cars of 1941. The letterboard lettering was 7 inches tall. The car numbers were 5 inches tall. The sill stripe, which had been discontinued in the middle 1930s, reappeared again in the late 1940s. The stripe was 3/4 inches wide and located 2 inches from the bottom of the car. Lettering was painted with imitation gold (yellow). In the 1960s, SR began moving the car number to the middle of the car as shown above
